

As always, the meeting will address your neighborhood and community questions and concerns.


In Loving Memory

In November, Lindale Park lost our beloved neighbor, Jesse G. Reyes Sr. A longtime resident of Lindale Park since 1960, Jesse came here looking for a better place to live for his wife, Frances, and two sons, Jesse Jr. and Ed.



An army veteran of World War II and a member of VFW Post 581, Jesse was an artist who enjoyed singing, sculpting, writing and poetry. By trade, he was an orthopedic brace maker who worked at Shriners Hospitals for Children for many years.

He was instrumental in the establishment of our Lindale Park Annual 4th of July Parade. His favorite serenade to the love of his life, Frances, was "It Had to Be You."

Chef Lindale Park

Graceland Street resident Dinah Massie brings us a healthy recipe that's easy to whip up and try out for a dinner side dish or a tasty party appetizer! Enjoy!

Smooth Garlic Hummus

Hummus is a bean dip made with chickpeas, or garbanzo beans. It is easy to make and tastes better than the store-bought variety. This recipe calls for tahini, a delicious paste made from sesame seeds – you can get it at the grocery store. If you omit the tahini, add extra olive oil. Or, substitute unsweetened peanut butter for tahini.

Ingredients

1 (15-ounce) can chickpeas (drained) or 1 1/2 cups cooked chickpeas, with 1/2 cup of the liquid reserved
 1/4 cup lemon juice (1 large lemon)
 1/4 cup well-stirred tahini (Tahini settles in the container, so be sure to stir it well before scooping out some.)
 1 - 3 large garlic cloves, depending on taste
 2-3 tablespoons olive oil, plus more for serving
 1/2 teaspoon ground cumin
 1/2 teaspoon ground turmeric (optional)
 Salt to taste
 Dash ground paprika, for garnish

Directions

Combine the tahini and lemon juice in a food processor and process for 1 minute. Scrape the sides and bottom of the bowl. Process for 30 seconds more.

Add the olive oil, minced garlic, spices and salt to the tahini and lemon juice mix.

Add half the drained chickpeas to the food processor and process for 1 minute.

The hummus probably will be too thick or not fully mixed. Add 2 to 3 tablespoons of the chickpea liquid until you reach the perfect consistency. The dip will thicken slightly in the fridge as the olive oil gels.

Scrape sides and bottom of the bowl, then add the remaining chickpeas.

Process until thick and smooth.

Scrape the sides and bottom of the processor bowl, then process once more. Add salt to taste.

Serve hummus with a drizzle of olive oil and dash of paprika. Dip with pita bread, pretzels or your favorite chips. Refrigerate up to one week.

Lindale's Annual Parade Gears Up for FUN

Art Cars, Marching Bands and Floats, Oh My! If we had to name one event that repeatedly brings joy and excitement to Lindale Park, it's our homegrown 4th of July Parade.

Year after year, it seems like no sooner one is finished that we start thinking about next year's "parade event." In fact, our team was so excited that we convinced ourselves this was going to be the 20th anniversary! Although premature, we will joyfully march the boulevard one more time to hit that historic landmark!

The concept for a parade came about from a conversation between two pillars of our neighborhood – Sen. Sylvia Garcia, who was city controller at the time, and the late Jesse Reyes Sr. (*Please see tribute to Mr. Reyes on the front page.*)

The parade is organized to honor veterans, public servants and all civilian and military personnel for putting our nation's needs before their own.

The **Lindale Park 19th Annual 4th of July Parade** will be at **10 a.m. Wednesday, July 4**. The route begins on Irvington Boulevard at Eleanor Street and heads south to Gale Street before making a U-turn and heading north on Irvington Boulevard ending on Eleanor Street.

Anyone who wishes to participate in the parade should send an email to info@lindalepark.org or drop off a note to 218 Joyce St. describing your group, vehicle and contact information, and we will confirm your registration.

There are no entry fees to general participants, but donations always are welcomed. All political affiliations are asked to make a \$200 donation to help us cover costs associated with City of Houston permitting, police presence and other items that assist us in ensuring everyone's safety, as well as showcasing various entries, and other ancillary costs connected with hosting the event.

Why I Cleaned the Esplanades

Why I chose to clean my neighborhood's esplanades and how I did so.

If you looked at the esplanades down Irvington Boulevard from Cavalcade Street to Kelley Street before Sunday, February 25, they would not be the best looking with some of their bricks messed up and their grasses trashed. So, I decided to take the matter in my own hands. My family and I cleaned 0.6 miles or 13 of the esplanades in my neighborhood.

We started with the esplanade closest to the CVS on Irvington Boulevard and Cavalcade Street and worked our way cleaning and fixing until we reached the esplanade at Kelley Street. Then we walked home, and I honestly did think that (I'm not just pretending I did so I sound thoughtful) if everyone cleaned up trash and stuff or at least cleaned up after themselves, wouldn't the oceans be cleaner?

I looked in a drainpipe near one of the esplanades, and there was a lot of trash in it. I cleaned the trash up, but I still think humans are the cause of animal's homes being destroyed. We need to come together to make the Earth cleaner because after all, isn't every day Earth day?

Baba Ganoush

Baba ganoush is a Mediterranean sauce or spread made from ground eggplant and tahini (a ground sesame seed paste), olive oil, lemon and garlic. You can get tahini at the local grocery store in the international foods area.

Ingredients

1 large eggplant
 1/4 cup tahini, plus more as needed
 3 garlic cloves, minced
 1/4 cup fresh lemon juice, plus more as needed
 1 pinch ground cumin
 salt, to taste
 1 tablespoon extra virgin olive oil
 1 tablespoon chopped fresh flat-leaf parsley
 1/4 cup brine-cured black olives, such as kalamata

Directions

Preheat oven to 375°F.
 Prepare a medium-hot fire in a charcoal grill. Or if you have a gas stove, turn on a burner.
 Prick the eggplant with a fork in several places and place on the grill rack 4 to 5 inches from the fire, or use tongs to hold the eggplant over the stove flame.
 Turn the eggplant frequently, until the skin blackens and blisters and the flesh begins to feel soft, 10 to 15 minutes.
 Transfer the eggplant to a baking sheet and bake until very soft, 15 to 20 minutes.
 Remove from the oven, let cool slightly and peel off and discard the skin.
 Place the eggplant flesh in a bowl.
 Use a fork to mash the eggplant.
 Add the 1/4 cup tahini, garlic, 1/4 cup lemon juice and cumin. Mix well.
 Season with salt, taste and add more tahini or lemon juice, if needed.
 Transfer to a serving bowl and spread with the back of a spoon to form a shallow well.
 Drizzle olive oil over the top and sprinkle with parsley.
 Place the olives around the sides.
 Serve at room temperature.

Lindale Park is on Nextdoor, a private social networking service for neighborhoods that makes it easy for you, your neighbors and your community to talk online. According to its website, Nextdoor was created based on the idea that the neighborhood is one of the most important and useful communities in a person's life. Its mission is to use technology to help neighbors build stronger and safer neighborhoods.

For new and old Lindale Park residents who've never heard of Nextdoor and want to connect with it OR for those members who want to learn more about it, here's a helpful Q & A with Lonnie Martinec, one of two Nextdoor Leads for Lindale Park. Lindale Park's other Nextdoor Lead is Nancy Brown.

Please note that Nextdoor is not part of the Lindale Park Civic Club, and both Lonnie and Nancy operate under guidelines put forth by Nextdoor.

How long has Lindale Park (LP) been part of the Nextdoor social network?

Lindale Park resident Mark Tipton, our original Lead, enrolled LP into the Nextdoor program in 2013. There are now 952 residents (48 percent of LP's households) with Nextdoor memberships.

What are your roles as Nextdoor Leads?

As uncompensated members, we help keep our neighborhood's forum running smoothly. Our nearby neighborhood posts fall under our purview as well, and nearby Leads help us keep an eye on LP posts. We accomplish this by ensuring that all posts fall within Nextdoor's stated guidelines. Although most members keep it friendly or follow the guidelines, Nancy and I have had to step in before to keep things on track.

What can members do on Nextdoor?

I liken Nextdoor to a really big fence all us neighbors can chat over. So far, it's been really great for lost and found and notifying neighbors about suspicious activities. Nextdoor has a great synopsis of what we can do on this forum:

On Nextdoor, members can:

- Share local recommendations (plumbers, auto mechanics, babysitters, etc.).
- Sell or give away household items.
- Publicize local events.
- Exchange information about crime and safety issues.
- Find neighbors in the directory.
- View a neighborhood map.
- Ask for advice.

Residents can choose to view and respond to updates via email or directly on the website.

Does Lindale Park have rules or guidelines on what to post and what not to post on Nextdoor?

Yes, and the main rule is "Be helpful, not hurtful."

Many times, we have had to remind members that this is NOT a public forum, nor Facebook. Because Nextdoor wants us to be able to have friendly discourse within their forum, posts that contain discrimination, attacks, insults, attempts to shame, bully or belittle are absolutely prohibited. We want all our neighbors to feel comfortable within this setting. As well, soapboxing in any form is not allowed. There is a complete list of clear guidelines available to all members on Nextdoor's Help Center at <https://help.nextdoor.com>.

As Leads, we are able to tag and vote on posts that do not follow stated guidelines; however, we are not able to remove or edit memberships. Only Nextdoor can do that.

I'm new to Lindale Park. How do I join Lindale Park on Nextdoor?

Welcome to Lindale Park! You can join by visiting https://nextdoor.com/choose_address. Please note that, because we are neighbors, we are NOT allowed to use fake names here. Please use your real name; otherwise, Nextdoor may edit or suspend your account. If you are not a resident of Lindale Park or do not own property within our neighborhood, you also cannot be a member of Nextdoor's Lindale Park group.

I have a business I'd like to promote on Nextdoor. Is that OK?

Yes, we love supporting local businesses. But – there are rules regarding this. Otherwise, Nextdoor might become a giant spam page, and none of us want that! For the specifics, refer to

How do I follow a post on Nextdoor?

Thank you SO much for asking that. As I said before, Nextdoor is not Facebook. Please do not post "Following" as a response to a post – this only bumps the post and then everyone receives all those "following" posts in their email inbox. All you need to do to follow a post is to click on the icon thanking the original poster, and you will receive updates.

If you have further questions for Lonnie Martinec, feel free to send her a private message on Nextdoor, and she'll be happy to assist.



Status of I-45 Expansion Project

Good news for those of us dreading the proposed widening of I-45 between I-10 to Loop 610 North, and the resulting noise and traffic congestion that would negatively impact Lindale Park – it will be quite a while before we see any changes created by the North Houston Highway Improvement Project.

“Implementation of the project near that section of the freeway (I-45 at Loop 610 North) will be at least three to four years in the future,” according to Pat Henry, director of project development at the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT).

Any improvements for that section have not yet been funded, according to Henry, meaning it could be even longer before construction crews start work between Cavalcade Street and the North Loop.

TxDOT’s proposed I-45 improvement project cuts across a wide swath of Houston, from downtown north to Beltway 8 and has been a source of contention for many reasons for all affected neighborhoods.

Of greatest impact to Lindale Park and to our neighbors is the plan to close the northbound side Patton Street exit, which would place a heavy burden on the Cavalcade Street exit and the bordering neighborhoods. The Patton Street exit would be closed, and the existing Love’s truck stop demolished, to provide space for a flood-control retention pond.

The entire project is expected to take at least 10 years to complete.

Letter from the President

Dear Lindale Park Neighbors,

I see this year as a chance to reconnect with you and to discover the things most important to each of us and the community at large.

The Lindale Park Civic Club (LPCC) is working on expanding our communication. We will be asking our neighbors to update their contact information through our neighborhood website. We also will email a survey, so we have a clear picture of what you think is important for the LPCC to achieve.

For instance, we know crime is a hot topic. We will share information about extra security patrol for the holiday season, as crime tends to increase from November through the first part of January. This may help in familiarizing you with cost associated with applying membership dues to offset the security expense in the short spans we do now.

There are two standard types of security patrol. One is a neighborhood watch program that requires background checks, training and a set number of citizens who would rotate patrolling and reporting suspicious activity to the Houston Police Department and Precinct One Constable's Office.

The other is done by way of a private security company. Generally, their proposals include a set work schedule and a set number of hours within a weekly period. When the patrol spots illicit or suspicious behavior, they detain the suspect if possible until HPD arrives and/or give information to police as needed to help with the capture of suspects. The patrol would be community wide but paid members would have the added benefit of home checks while they were away on vacation.

A neighborhood watch and private security are options we can have presented to you. Then, take the necessary steps to gain support for the program chosen by the community.

At our August 28 Quarterly Meeting, there were five open board positions to serve a two-year term (August 31, 2018-August 31, 2020). Voting resulted with the following to hold that term: Anthony Fry, Lonnie Martinec, Ed Reyes, Camille Webb and Matt Zeis.

In September, we bid farewell to longtime board member, Gwyn Guidy, who resigned from the board after serving for more than 10 years. Guidy was instrumental in implementing and securing the City of Houston's Chapter 42 minimum lot size protections for all of Lindale Park, as

well as leading countless other projects for the betterment of our neighborhood.
