Love For Dogs Grows into New Space

Welcome “Love For Dogs” (LFD) to Lindale Park, now located at 5701 Irvington Boulevard at Woodard Street, three blocks south of the North Loop, next to the Valero gas station.

The owners, Ana Guzman-Brazil and Montana Brazil, are Lindale Park residents. The business began about two years ago in their home, and it grew so popular and fast that they needed more space to accommodate people who wanted their dogs trained and cared for by Ana and her staff. So, they rented their new, much larger location and moved in this past August.

The Dog Training – Daycare – Boarding business appears very organized and in a very clean and nicely decorated facility that looks a lot different inside than what you might think it would from the outside.

They have a very large training and exercise room just behind the large reception area. While there gathering information for this article, they had a dog walking on a treadmill, which according to Ana, helps with the dog’s balance as well as getting the dog needed exercise.

Ana and the LFD staff train dogs for Frisbee competitions, obedience, agility, protection sports and temperament. They are very serious about “temperament” of the dogs, and all dogs are tested for temperament on their first visit with their dog owners present.

Dogs staying at LFD have a regimen that includes timely meals, naps, playtime and exercise.

Ana is very adamant about exercise for pet dogs. For the people who complain that they can’t get their dogs to settle down, Ana says it’s normally because their dogs don’t get the exercise they need.

Dogs staying at LFD get plenty of exercise, so when they go home at the end of the day, they are calm, as they’ve had their exercise while at LFD.

Lodge Fundraises to Replace Stolen AC

Like many of those who post on the Nextdoor neighborhood platform about thefts or vandalism, our own Lindale Park Lodge 1347 was a victim as well.

“Despite two six-foot-tall fences, vandals cut the copper tubing from both of our 10-ton AC units,” Lodge Secretary Kenneth Sparks says. “They probably got less than \$100 for the copper, but the cost to us for the replacement and recharge of the units will likely exceed \$4,000.”

To help raise money toward replacing the Lodge's air conditioning units, the Lodge plans to hold a **Louisiana Style Crawfish Boil Fundraiser** beginning at **noon Saturday, March 26**. The Lodge is located at 202 Avenue of Oaks Street on the corner at Fulton Street.



Lindale Park Poised to Preserve Setbacks

“Individuality of attractive homes, accentuated in Lindale Park by large lots with homes set back at a uniform distance, makes every street a picturesque scene” boasts a Lindale Park sales brochure from the 1930s to 1940s.

“We work hard to keep the overall flow and feel of the neighborhood consistent,” says Nadia Heffernan, Lindale Park Civic Club President. “We worked with the City of Houston in 2014 to 2015 to establish Special Minimum Lot Sizes. We also ask that residents respect the front setbacks to maintain the beautiful front yards and streets that make our neighborhood.”

While the Special Minimum Lot Size protections Lindale Park has in place are good for 40 years, they only control the size of the lot. They do not set standards for setbacks.

A setback is the minimum distance that a building or other structure must be set back from a street or road.

Lindale Park is ready to take the next steps to preserve the character of our neighborhood by pursuing **Special Minimum Building Line (SMBL)** protection for Lindale Park.

For example, if a 15-foot Special Minimum Building Line is established for your block, no structures will be permitted to be built with a building line of less than 15 feet from the road, according to City of Houston’s Planning and Development Department application to establish SMBL.

One block in Lindale Park already is protected under SMBL, thanks to volunteer Kathy Gutierrez, who secured the protection for her block of Gale Street.

A planning group already met May 5 at Canary Café to start the applications for Special Minimum Building Line.

“There’s a group effort of neighbors who are concerned about our lot setbacks and preserving the character and trees in Lindale Park,” says Sara Eakens, who lives on Moody Street and attended the meeting at Canary Café.

Board members who helped attain the lot size effort were in attendance, too, as well as several concerned residents ready to volunteer.

“The Civic Club is going to back this effort 100 percent, so it’s not a cost burden,” says Gwyn Guidy, who was instrumental in securing the lot size ordinance for Lindale Park.

It will take MANY volunteers to get applications submitted to secure setback protections for Lindale Park.

To volunteer to submit the application for your block or to learn more about the process, send email to info@lindalepark.org or come to the **Q2 Quarterly Meeting** at 7 p.m. **Tuesday, May 24** to hear from **City Planner Abraham Zorrilla**, who will give a presentation about SMBL, followed by a question and answer session.

Speaking of beautification, please remember that **trash and recycling bins** are to be placed on the street no earlier than 6 p.m. the night before pick up and should be brought in promptly following pick up. Learn more at: <https://houstontx.gov/solidwaste/trashfacts.pdf>.

The Solid Waste Management Department has an app you can download to be informed if the schedule is delayed - **HTX Collects**. If your neighbors haven't pulled their bins in on time, consider giving them a hand. We can all use a little help sometimes.

Similarly, **tree trash and heavy trash** should not be placed out more than one weekend ahead of the scheduled pick up date. Not only is it ugly, it creates a flooding risk during heavy rainstorms. This being Houston, we never know when one of those will happen!

Thank you to those residents who have gotten involved to protect the character of our neighborhood by reaching out to developers and the City of Houston to preserve the beautiful trees and building setbacks. Remember... It's ODD!!!

One way to remember that only tree/yard waste is collected in odd-numbered months is that "It's ODD!!!" **The approximate day for collecting Heavy Trash is the**



First Friday of Each Month, whether it's tree/yard waste or junk.

Let's help keep Lindale Park beautiful at all times.

According to the City of Houston:

"Tree Waste" is defined as "clean" wood waste such as tree limbs, branches and stumps. Lumber, furniture and treated wood will NOT be accepted.

"Junk Waste" is defined as items, such as furniture, appliances and other bulky material. The city won't pick up tires or construction debris.

Tree Waste is accepted during Junk Waste Months; however, to ensure your Tree Waste is recycled, you may hold your tree waste materials until the next Tree Waste designated month or take it to a Neighborhood Depository/Recycling Center **with a driver's license AND a recent utility bill for proof of residency!**



Roberto and Beatriz Torres have lived in and around Lindale Park for almost 35 years. They and their adult children live in four homes in Lindale Park.

They opened the small family Mexican restaurant located on the corner of Irvington Boulevard and Moody Street at 4707B Irvington Boulevard in May 2020. (Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, they closed the restaurant temporarily only one month later. They were closed for exactly one year and reopened June 1, 2021.)

El Paraiso is a true "family-owned business," as one of the owners' sons, a CPA, is their business accountant, and their daughters help in the restaurant from time-to-time.

El Paraiso was formerly located in the Montrose area starting in 1978. Beatriz's mother opened the restaurant with Beatriz's help. Then, Roberto and Beatriz took over ownership three years later and have operated it ever since.

The recipes used by El Paraiso are mostly old family recipes, including the homemade salsa, original chips, menudo and enchiladas, including the popular green enchiladas. Mole sauce is made from scratch as well and is a favorite of regular diners.

Although they serve beer, wine and margaritas, the drinks are available for the diners to enjoy, as El Paraiso is all about "the food." That's what makes El Paraiso a great asset for all Lindale Park residents.

Let's Work Together to Combat Litter

Walking my dogs daily through the streets of Lindale Park always sparks a sense of gratitude for the privilege of being a homeowner in this community dubbed *Houston's Hidden Jewel*.

Unlike many inner-city neighborhoods in our area, our mostly modest bungalow-type homes have ample space between neighbors and are situated on wide-curbed streets. Downtown buildings are easily viewed from the sidewalks on Irvington Boulevard, which is separated by bike lanes and beautiful esplanades.

However, coupled with my sense of gratitude, unfortunately, is dismay at the amount of visible litter along the way. As a sort of public service announcement, I would like to address the litter issue and suggest ways we can help alleviate this problem that defaces and devalues our neighborhood.

Next time you are out, make a conscious effort to note the ubiquitous litter around Lindale Park. There is litter on side streets, along Irvington Boulevard and around surrounding businesses.

Curb litter directly in front of homes includes scratched off lottery tickets, remnants from recycle or trash bins that got away on trash day, uncollected *La Voz* newspapers, empty water bottles, empty beer cans and heavy trash placed on curbs way ahead of collection day.

On Irvington Boulevard, litter includes soft drink and beer cans/bottles, fast food trash, empty cigarette packaging, expired garage/yard sale signs, dirty rags/clothing/or towels, wiring of various sorts or just tiny litter, such as gum/candy wrappers or cigarette butts.

The nearby businesses host an array of litter, despite trash receptacles between gas pumps.

Addressing the litter problem on an individual basis is like "moving the deckchairs on the Titanic." As such, here are easy steps we ALL can take toward a less littered Lindale Park community:

1. Keep your immediate living area clean and free of litter. Ensure your front yard and the street area in front of your home is free from litter and debris.
2. Keep heavy trash off the curb and out of sight until the day before heavy trash pick-

up day. If items are not picked up, remove from the curb until a pick-up date is confirmed.

3. If you walk yourself or your pets, take an extra plastic grocery bag and pick up litter along the way. Once the bag is full, dispose of it properly.

4. Participate in Love Lindale Park events that occur on the second Saturday of the odd months. The next Love LP Cleanup event **September 10** with a focus on Helmers Street. It is great way to help AND to meet people who live in our community.

5. If you have a bus stop at the corner of your street at Irvington Boulevard, please contact METRO Customer Service (713-635-4000) and insist that a trash receptacle be placed there.

6. Politely ask business owners/employees to keep their premises litter-free and offer to assist them in doing so.





Shining the Spotlight on Local Businesses

Gagootz

Gagootz, 5903 Fulton St., the new bar located at the corner of Fulton and Delaney Streets (between Eleanor and Kelley Streets on the west side of Fulton Street), former location of K Bar, is now open.

It is an “eclectic” establishment, a fusion of Mexican, Italian and American, in their décor, food and drinks. Even though it’s a “bar,” they serve great food, including Mexican tacos and tostadas, Italian pasta and seafood dishes and American specialty burgers and wings.

The very original name of the bar, “Gagootz,” is an Italian slang expression meaning “crazy in the head” or “loco en la cabeza” in Spanish.

Eduardo Alvarado, the owner and operator of the bar is of Mexican-American heritage, born in the United States and got his experience in hospitality working from a young age in an Italian restaurant in the greater Houston area.

The bar’s décor is mostly all recycled materials, but it all “fits together.” For instance, not all the chairs match, but one doesn’t really seem to notice as there is so much to look at in the colorfully decorated Gagootz.

Wall murals are in the works and already show likenesses of Frida Kahlo and Emiliano Zapata on the south wall. They’ll soon be joined by other colorful individuals.

The drink list at Gagootz is lengthy and is supplemented with four infused tequilas, with more choices to come, maybe as many as 10. So far, infused tequilas include flavors blueberry-jalapeno, mango, pineapple and strawberry. (I tried a combination of mango and pineapple in a margarita, and it was delicious.)

All the healthy juices used in their drinks are freshly mixed daily, and they discard juices left over at closing time. (And, to keep it healthy, they rarely use sugar, as agave syrup is their sweetener of choice.)

Eduardo is very friendly and personable and likes feedback from his customers, especially now as it’s a new business. So, if you have suggestions, don’t be hesitant to let him know. He’s very happy with his location here.
